FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Friends

Having been reminded that Jesus calls us his disciples to self-denial and sacrifice, and considered what that might mean for our attitude towards our wealth and money, this week we turn to what is often even harder to give: our time.

Serving: giving sacrificially of our time.

Whilst we might always be able (through hard work, effort or the generosity of others) gain more money, none of us can gain time. Each and every one of us has 24, 60-minute hours per day and not a second more. The question then is- how shall we use them?

Of course, we don't have 24 free hours to spare. Sleeping, washing, eating and household chores take up a lot of that time. If we work or care for children or adults in need, our 'free time' shrinks hugely. Take out time for daily devotions and for rest and we begin to see that what's left sometimes doesn't amount to much. It's all too easy to begin to feel possessive about those precious hours and reluctant to use them in the service of God in the church.

Of course, our local church isn't the only place we serve God. We are called to serve him in our homes, in our relationships, at work, amongst our neighbours and everywhere we go. After all, 'we are not our own, we have been bought with a price.' (1 Corinthians 6:20) That call to serve God in the everyday, to be salt and light everywhere is worth reflecting on. Are we seeking to serve asking God in our workplace and homes and clubs? What that might look like if we were to do that more. These 2 books might help think this through.

But it's at church where I want to focus my challenge. How do you serve there? For the true disciple, church cannot simply be a place to go and receive from the LORD. Our Church is the community or family of God's people of which we are a part, and when families gather, there is always work to do! Much of this is practical and requires very little expertise: welcoming, cleaning, preparing and serving refreshments, gardening, tidying. But all these tasks require time and effort. Other jobs such as Bible reading, leading intercessions, pastoral visiting, teaching children or evangelism have a more spiritual flavour, but with some help, training and support, none of us are beyond serving in these ways too. All it takes is a commitment to use our time to serve God and his church.

Our time is limited. We cannot do everything. So, if we are to be willing and obedient servants, it will require self-denial and self-sacrifice, making a conscious choice to give up time spent on other things and using it to serve God. Why not take some time this week to look over your diary and prayerfully consider how you are using your time.

Parish Prayer Gatherings: The next Evening Prayer Gathering will be on Monday 24th March at 7:45 p.m. The next MORNING PRAYER GATHERING will be on Monday 31st March from 9:15 a.m. to 10 a.m. Both will be at St Paul's.

Car Parking at St Paul's: Over the last few months we have noticed an increasing number of people from outside of our church community are using the car park at St Paul's. This has

meant that those coming for midweek services or events in the hall have found it harder (and sometimes impossible) to find somewhere to park. We are therefore bringing in a system of permits for those coming to regular groups so we can monitor the situation.

As long as there are no busy services or large events in the hall, we're happy for church members to occasionally use the car park when they head into town. But from next week we are going to ask members of our church family who wish to use the car park in this way, to collect a car park permit from the office, and to display it in their car windscreen when they park at St Paul's. You won't need to do this when you are coming for a service or a church meeting. You will need one if you're using the car park at other times.

These permits are free and will be renewed every year. Mel will keep a record of your name and car registration number next to the number of the permit, so we can make sure they're not being copied!
