### FROM OUR RECTOR

### Dear Friends

Having been reminded that Jesus calls us his disciples to self-denial and sacrifice, considered what that might mean for our attitude towards our money and our time, how it affects our prayer lives, this week we turn to fasting.

### Fasting: showing that the LORD is God over our bodies

I have a confession to make. I'm not that keen on fasting. It's not that I don't see the benefit of fasting as a spiritual exercise. Practising fasting whether from food, drink, TV, social media or whatever, is a wonderful way of developing self-control and training ourselves in godliness. That's a theme that appears in many of Paul's letters. Neither is it because I think the Bible is silent on the matter. In Matthew chapter 6 Jesus says, "when you give... when you pray... and when you fast." We have no problem thinking of prayer and giving as direct commands of God but somehow, we have relegated fasting to something that only fanatics do, or that we only dabble with during the season of Lent.

If I'm honest, my reticence about fasting is simply that it is often hard and regularly inconvenient. But surely that's the point. Fasting is meant to be hard and costly and inconvenient, because as we subject our bodies and our wills to it, so we grow in the kind of resilience and strength that is necessary to grow in godliness, holiness and wisdom. Listen to Paul's instructions on the matter from 1 Corinthians 9:

<sup>24</sup> Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. <sup>25</sup> Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever. <sup>26</sup> Therefore I do not run like someone running aimlessly; I do not fight like a boxer beating the air. <sup>27</sup> No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize.

Our spiritual lives are not just a matter for our souls and minds, but for our bodies too. Our physical desires must also be subjected to discipline under the direction of the Scriptures so that they do not hinder our walk of faith. Bad physical habits will affect our spiritual lives, as they will affect our ability to serve God with energy, time and passion. And like our minds and hearts, our bodies must also be trained in ways that are godly and right. It isn't just our souls that Jesus purchased on the cross, but all of us, our bodies included. That's what Paul says in 1 Corinthians 6: *You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore, honour God with your bodies.* 

So how might we begin to use fasting to grow in self-control and godliness as disciples of Jesus? It might be giving up something we love for Lent. It might be missing one meal a week. It might mean turning off the TV more often, or cutting out something else that distracts you from your walk with Jesus? Whatever it is, try to remember these 4 points:

- Jesus fasted, the apostles fasted and Christians across the ages have fasted. It might feel strange
   but it isn't weird.
- Don't make a song and dance about it: keep it between you + God. (See Matt 15:16)
- When you feel the pain of the fast, try to turn your heart to God in praise for all he has done for you, and remember your ultimate goal is to grow more like Jesus.
- Remember Sundays are feast days. They do not count in the 40 days of Lent, and they should be days to celebrate God's goodness with his people.

Happy fasting! May it be a blessing to us in these coming days and help us grow in self-control and holiness as we walk the way of Jesus, the way of the Cross.
