# FROM OUR RECTOR

#### Dear Friends

In recent decades, Christianity has become a more private religion in the UK. Something that a person might believe in, seek to live by, and even a set of spiritual practises to keep- but all done quietly and secretly, that no one else needs to know about.

That can certainly be true of the spiritual disciplines of giving and praying and fasting. In fact, Jesus encourages his followers not to do these things 'to be seen by people.' Of course it's harder to serve secretly. Practical service is naturally visible, even if it should never be done to gain praise from people. But in these last 2 reflections, I want to encourage us all to live out our faith in very public ways. By sharing our faith in our words (that's next week) and this week, by showing hospitality. Because as a Christian, Jesus must also be LORD over our homes.

The early church was wonderful at this. Acts 2:46-47 expresses it this way: <sup>46</sup> Every day the believers continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, <sup>47</sup> praising God and enjoying the favour of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

For the early church, practicing hospitality was a natural extension of the worship that took place in the temple courts and elsewhere. I say natural, because as Christians we are family- brothers and sisters in Christ. And families (at least those with healthy relationships and who live near each other) spend time in one another's houses. They eat together, talk together and hang out together. They share their lives together. It was clear mark of the true faith and fellowship of the early church, and if Christ is to be seen in our midst, it is something that we <u>need</u> to develop as well.

And I say need because numerous times in the scriptures we are commanded to show hospitality to others. Here are 3.

Romans 12:13 - Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality.

<u>Hebrews 13:2</u> - Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it.

1 Peter 4:9 - Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling.

So, when was the last time you invited some of your Christian brothers and sisters into your home to share food with you? It doesn't need to be a gourmet meal. Just a few extra portions of the things you usually eat! Neither does your house need to be a palace, or spotlessly clean before you open the doors to your Church family. They are <u>family</u> after all. The bond of mutual Christian love should be more than enough for your visitors to ignore the unfinished ironing or to be satisfied by beans on toast, if that's what's on offer.

So, can I encourage us all to get better at this Christian discipline over the coming months? If a meal is too big a jump, start with coffee and biscuits. And whilst you might like to start by inviting some folks you know well, be brave enough to invite some people that you don't. The early church grew in love and strength and 'in the favour of all the people' partly because they were known as welcoming, hospitable people who loved one another and shared their lives and their homes. Let's seek to grow in this spiritual discipline over the coming months that Christ might be seen in our midst too.

So don't sit and wait to be asked. Do the inviting!

# PCC Meeting- held Monday 7<sup>th</sup> April, 2025.

Our PCC meeting, the last before the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) in May, opened in worship and praise, looking at Article 13 of the 39 Articles: Of works before justification.

The majority of the evening was spent receiving reports on our finances and buildings. I hope you have all seen the update on our Parish Finances circulated to our churches over the past 2

weeks. If not, can I encourage you to seek out a copy and prayerfully review your own giving in the light of what you read.

The PCC were talked through the proposed changes at St Paul's and the progress of seeking Diocesan permission to do the work. A meeting with our church architect has been arranged for after Easter when will know to what extent we need to review our plans. The PCC were also updated on works at other churches and spent some time discussing an energy efficiency report commissioned for Abbotsbury.

As well as looking ahead to the APCM, when several PCC members will be standing down or standing for re-election, we thanked them for their efforts, especially Barbara Garrick for her excellent service as PCC secretary. The PCC also noted that Clive Sawers, one of our organists, will be retiring from regular playing from the end of June and expressed gratitude for his service to the Parish. Clive has been playing the in the parish for almost 20 years but feels that now is the right time to step down. We'll be saying a formal goodbye to him at our joint parish service at the end of our Church Weekend at Home at the end of June.

The PCC also began a conversation about the possibility of appointing a part-time buildings and business manager to take a load from the shoulders of our clergy and church wardens. A small working party will be set up after Easter to discuss this further.

If you would like to know more about what went on at PCC, do speak to your PCC reps or Church wardens.
