FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Friends

The most emotional goodbye I've ever known was my last night at Teacher Training College in Lincoln. We'd been given our degree certificates in the Cathedral and enjoyed our valedictory ball. But somewhere towards midnight the DJ decided to play 'Everybody Hurts' by Rem and I crumpled into a blubbering mess. The knowledge that I'd never again see many of the people with whom I'd spent the last 4 years hit me like a sledgehammer. Saying goodbye was so very, very hard.

After his emotional reinstatement on the beach, Peter, and the other disciples, were about to face a painful goodbye. After 40 days of resurrection appearances, teaching, joy and fellowship, it was time for Jesus to leave this world and return to his Father. Ascension Day was coming.

Of all the Christian festivals I suspect Ascension Day gets the least attention. Perhaps next year we will have a special service to mark Jesus' return to Heaven, but this year we'll make do with the lectionary readings on Sunday which will take us back to that day. For that reason, I won't say anything about the position to which Jesus ascended and what he is doing now. We'll reflect on both of those on Sunday. But I do want to reflect for a moment on the pain of that goodbye, especially for Peter, and how he was able to cope with it.

What a journey Peter had been on! From that day by the lake when Jesus called Peter to follow him (Luke 5), Peter had been in the inner circle. That hadn't stopped Peter making a fool of himself again and again (Mark 8), but despite his fears and failures (see the last 2 weeks!) Peter loved Jesus with every part of his being. But now Jesus was going away, and in this life at least, Peter would never see Jesus again.

So how did Peter (and the others) cope?

Firstly, they knew it was only **temporary**. Jesus himself said that he was going to prepare a place for them and that he would come back to take them to be with him forever. (John 14) The angels on the mountain top had told them the same thing after the ascension. The separation was only temporary and that gave Peter (and us) great hope for the future.

Secondly, the separation was **necessary**. Jesus had told them that during the Last Supper. He needed to go away so that the comforter, the Holy Spirit, could come. Now, Jesus can be with all his followers, by His Spirit, all at the same time, wherever they are! The separation equipped the church for what came next.

Finally, the separation was **preparatory**. The ascension of Jesus led directly to Pentecost and the explosion of Christian witness. We'll think more about that in the next 2 weeks, but with Jesus now ascended, the stage was set for God to pour out his Holy Spirit on all believers, equipping them with the power and strength to take the gospel out to the world. The separation passed the baton from Jesus to his disciples... and to us.

Goodbyes are often painful and it's not wrong to weep as we move on and leave people and places behind. But by God's grace those partings and endings are usually new beginnings that, filled with the hope of what is still to come, can propel us out into the world, following God's call wherever that leads.

I'm sure it was an emotional goodbye for Peter, but by God's grace it was temporary, necessary and preparatory. For Peter's greatest task was only just beginning. Perhaps yours is too!

Pentecost Prayer Walk Around the 6 Churches of the Benefice.

On Saturday 7th June, the day before Pentecost - we'll be walking around all of the 6 churches in our benefice, pausing to pray in each one and at key points along the way. We'll be starting at <u>St Luke's at 10am</u> (*note the change of time*) then walking to St Paul's, St Mary's, St Bart's, All Saints and ending at Abbotsbury around lunchtime. The timetable will come out nearer the time but do get the date in your diary now. And if you can't make the whole trip- that's fine! Just come and join us where you can.

Lunch with God: Starting on Friday 6th June we'll be starting a weekly town centre outreach. The aim is to give short (5-10 minute) Bible talks every 20 minutes from 12:30pm to 1:30pm, with opportunities for those listening to ask questions and take a Bible or a gospel away to find out more. We'll be setting up in the area at Golden Lion Square.

I'd like... <u>everyone</u> to pray for people to gather and engage and for God's Spirit to do God's work through God's Word. I'd also love a few volunteers to come along - some to create a crowd and a couple of others to be handing out leaflets to passers-by in the main pedestrian precinct.

If things go well, we'll move into St Paul's Hall for the winter season, where we can offer free tea and coffee and a warm space for folks to enjoy their own lunch whilst feeding on God's Word.
