FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Friends

One of the big factors always taken into account when countries are bidding to host the Olympic Games is the legacy they will leave behind. In London that was seen in world class sporting venues still being used, the regeneration of a former derelict area and an increased take up of sports across the country. These days all projects have to consider their impact on the environment and those living there. And rightly so. We want to know what will happen after all the work is done or after the grand event has taken place.

So what of Pentecost? What was the lasting legacy of the outpouring of God's Holy Spirit upon his people?

Some of the impact was immediate. The disciples were empowered to speak new languages, and they went out and proclaimed Jesus to the gathered crowds.

Their preaching had an impact too. 3000 believed and were baptised that very day. And of course, as peoples' lives were changed, they passed on the torch of faith to others, and <u>they</u> passed it on to others, and the chain continued across the ages and oceans until someone passed the good news of Jesus on to us. Hopefully you can see what <u>our</u> role is!

But the lasting impact wasn't just in the communication of the gospel message. The coming of the Spirit caused communities of faith to form, and these were shaped with gospel values. We see this in the last few verses of Acts 2:

The new believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favour of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

How many lasting impacts of Pentecost can you see here? I've found 8 but there may be more!

- 1. A devotion to growing in the true faith (to the apostles' teaching, studying the scriptures.)
- 2. A devotion to meeting together (regular 'church worship' and small gatherings)
- 3. They regularly ate together (a sign of deep relationships)
- 4. And were devoted to praying together (a sign of real faith and reliance on God)

- 5. They were generous to those in need (*selling their possessions if needs be*)
- 6. They were full of joy- recognising that all good gifts came from God.
- 7. They enjoyed the favour of others outside the faith (*suggesting Godly lives and Christ-like characters*)
- 8. And the church continued to grow as more and more people came to faith (*a reminder that the passing on of the gospel didn't stop*).

Since the Holy Spirit continues His work today and still lives with and in God's people, these 8 impacts continue to be true signs of a lively, faithful worshipping community where God is at work. So how well do we match up?

We have more people in Bible study groups than last year, and we've seen an increase in regular Sunday attendance, with some of that increase coming from people who have recently become Christians. But perhaps there is a challenge here regarding being faithful in prayer, in our generosity and in making such a difference in our communities, through our words and lives and witness, that we regularly see people coming to trust in Jesus.

But since we cannot change ourselves, we too need a fresh work of the Holy Spirit in and amongst us. May that be our prayer as we go through these coming weeks!

The Parochial Church Council meeting held on 4th June 2025 - Summary

As usual, we began with worship and looking at one of the 39 Articles and prayer.

As a new PCC we reminded ourselves that of the need to prepare for meetings and be committed to attend, to listen to others, to share our vision but to keep our discussions confidential and to remember that the church belongs to God and he through Jesus has given us a mission to make disciples.

We appointed Reg Cross and Andy Faulkner as vice chairs, co-opted Clare Lillington and Barbara Garrick as treasurer and secretary, and (subject to her agreement) Mel Dunn as electoral roll officer.

We have agreed a pay rise in line with the retail price index for our admin staff and agreed a system to keep them safe when they are working alone.

We continue to make safeguarding a priority and will be focussed on all volunteers completing DBS and safeguarding training within three months of the start of their role.

We received news from all of our churches and noted that the building work has commenced on the improved kitchen and toilet facilities at Highweek

We discussed the parish's Five Key Values and some of the questions and challenges posed by our progress so far.
