FROM OUR VICAR

Dear Friends.

Discovering Our Rhythm of Faith

As the nights draw in and the long days of summer give way to darker evenings, many of us find that our routines begin to shift. The light fades earlier, the pace slows, and life takes on a different rhythm. This seasonal change can be more than just a matter of daylight. This can prompt us to wonder how our spiritual rhythms might adapt too.

I came across The Diocese of Bristol's "Finding your individual rhythms" resource this week, which invites us to explore a Rhythm of Life — not a one-size-fits-all programme, but a pattern shaped by listening to what God is saying to each of us within the wider community of faith. (bristol.anglican.org) We are reminded that spiritual vitality usually grows not through occasional bursts of activity, but through gentle, consistent habits that welcome God into the fabric of our ordinary days.

Christians across the centuries have found that such practices, sometimes called a rule of life, can help us stay rooted in God's grace. In Ignatian spirituality, for example, there is a deep attentiveness to the movements of the soul: noticing where we find consolation and where we experience struggle, and shaping our days around prayer, reflection, service, and rest. These patterns are not about restriction, but about freedom.

Jesus expressed this beautifully when he said, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free" (John 8:31–32). To continue in his word, to live with him at the centre of our days, is to discover the kind of rhythm that leads to freedom and joy.

As we move into winter, perhaps we as a church family can see this as an opportunity to discover our rhythm together. For some of us, that might mean a few quiet moments of prayer in the morning; for others, a weekly act of service or a shared meal with friends. Some might try the examen (a short reflection at the end of the day to notice where God has been at work). Whatever form it takes, the important thing is that we walk this journey alongside one another.

Together, we might pause to reflect on how our daily lives are changing with the season; choose one small, life-giving practice to sustain us; and, after a while, review what has helped us to grow in faith.

Our rhythm this winter may be slower and quieter, but that, too, can be holy. As we walk through the darker months, may we find in our shared rhythm of faith the steady heartbeat of God's presence, guiding, grounding, and freeing us to live as disciples of Jesus in every season.
